Death - On Tuesday last as Robert Rawlings, an industrious man belonging to the Earldoms, who supported himself by the carriage of fire-wood, &c. from the New Forest, was driving his waggon from thence to Winchester, in coming down Alderbury Shoot, he observed something out of place near the wheels, and unfortunately endeavouring to get it to rights, without stopping the horses, the streak caught his smock frock, and dragged him under the wheels, by which he was so much bruised that he died in about four hours after.
