*Little Hinton*  
1850 - 1899

**1869**

Fire :- A fire broke out between two and three o'clock on Wednesday morning in some farm buildings at Little Hinton, in the occupation of **Mr Thomas Brown**, of Lower Upham, and the whole of the cart stabling was destroyed. It was fortunately discovered by the police before it had made much head, and with the aid of the Bishopstone fire engine, and the ready assistance of its inhabitants, was got under in a few hours. But for its timely discovery, a large amount of property might have been destroyed. The fire is supposed to have arisen from an ash-hole.

COUNTY COURT, WEDNESDAY (before his Honour Deputy Judge Fraset). There was a very heavy list of cases, no courts having been held for the past two months.

The first action which came on was a dispute between two neighbouring farmers, **Henry Thorne** and **Henry Jeans**, living at Little Hinton.

Mr G. A. Butterworth appeared for Jeans, and Mr A. E. Withy for Thorne. The plaintiff's claim was for £9 15s. For sheep feed, and the counter claim was for £10 in respect of a deal about some straw. After hearing the evidence, his Honour gave judgment for plaintiff for £7 15s. On the claim, and dismissed the counter claim.
