Ludgershall Inclosure Meeting Notice 1851

I, FRANCIS ATTWOOD, of the Close, Salisbury, in the County of Wilts, the Valuer acting in the matter of the INCLOSURE of the COMMON, called Spray Leaze and No Man's Ball, situate in the parish of Ludgershall, in the County of Wilts, hereby give Notice,

That I shall hold a MEETING, on the 2.th day of August, at the Queen's Head Inn, in the said parish of Ludgershall, at eleven in the Forenoon, for the purpose of receiving claims in writing from all persons claiming any common or other right or interest in the said Common, and such claims must state the several particulars in respect whereof they are made, distinguishing the claims in respect of Freehold, Copyhold, Customary, and Leasehold Property from each other, and mentioning therein the places of abode of the respective Claimants, or their Agents, at which notices in respect of such claims may be delivered. And I hereby further give Notice, that this is the last Meeting which will be holden in the matter of the said proposed Inclosure for the receipt of Claims.
