

CORONERS INQUESTS



Thomas Cook 1837

An inquest was taken on Tuesday, at Ludgershall, on a man named Thomas Cook. The deceased was nearly 60 years of age.

He had been at work all day on Saturday, in his usual health. On Sunday morning his wife left him in bed but hearing a slight noise about half an hour afterward, she went into his room and found him at the point of death. He lived but a few minutes afterwards.

Verdict - Died by the Visitation of God.
