We remember the names of the men of Bradenstoke

who fell in the First World War:

Second Lieutenant Hubert William Corke

C Company 10th Battalion The Gloucestershire Regiment Born in Bradenstoke Vicarage Son of the Reverend Hubert and Louisa Corke Killed in action in France on 19th April 1916 aged 21

Private Frank Edwards

2nd Battalion The Wiltshire Regiment Son of Henry and Emily Edwards of The Abbey, Bradenstoke Killed in action in France on 8th July 1916 aged 28

Lance Bombardier Charles William Farmer

302nd Siege Battery Royal Garrison Artillery Husband of Mable Anne Farmer of the Post Office, Bradenstoke Died of wounds in Italy on 15th June 1918 aged 38

Private Henry George Ferris

5th Battalion The Wiltshire Regiment Grandson of Charles and Ann Ferris of Bradenstoke Died in Mesopotamia on 23rd October 1916 aged 26

Private Frank Harper

5th Battalion The Wiltshire Regiment Son of Timothy and Eliza Harper of The Banks Died of wounds in Mesopotamia on 7th April 1917 aged 25 ©Wiltshire OPC Project/Cathy Sedgwick/2015

Private William Highnam

1st Battalion The Wiltshire Regiment Son of Richard and Mary Highnam of Bradenstoke Died of wounds in France on 22nd July 1917 aged 32

Private John Hunt

1st Battalion The Wiltshire Regiment Son of Henry Hunt of Lillybrook Killed in action in Belgium on 16th June 1915 aged 19

Private Frederick Charles King

1st Battalion The Royal Berkshire Regiment Younger son of Henry and Eliza King of Bradenstoke Killed in action in France on 28th September 1915 aged 30

Private Thomas George King

2nd Battalion The Wiltshire Regiment Older son of Henry and Eliza King of Bradenstoke Killed in action in France on 9th April 1917 aged 40

Gunner William James Mason

D Battery 232nd Brigade Royal Field Artillery Son of Walter and Emma Mason of Bradenstoke Died of wounds in England on 9th February 1918 aged 24

Private Sidney William Skull

B Company 1st/4th Battalion The Wiltshire Regiment Son of Elijah and Mary Skull of Bradenstoke Killed in action in Egypt on 9th April 1918 aged 20

Private Walter Ewart Watson

1st Battalion The Wiltshire Regiment Born in Bradenstoke, son of Frederick and Ada Watson Killed in action in Belgium on 17th February 1917 aged 18

Private James Egbert Wilkins

5th Battalion The Wiltshire Regiment Born in Bradenstoke, son of Benjamin and Sarah Jane Wilkins Killed in action in Mesopotamia on 18th April 1916 aged 30

We complete our roll by remembering also the soldier of the Second World War buried here in Bradenstoke:

Trooper Leslie Hunt 4th Battalion The Royal Tank Regiment Son of Frank and Agnes Hunt Died on 24th June 1940 aged 21
