

## Kellys Directory Extract 1903 Maddington



MADDINGTON is a parish and village, on the road from Salisbury to Devizes, 6 miles north from Wishford station on the Salisbury branch of the Great Western railway, 6 west from Amesbury and 11 north-west from Salisbury, in the Southern division of the county, hundred of Branch and Dole, Amesbury union, Salisbury county court district, petty sessional division of Salisbury and Amesbury, rural deanery of Wylye (Wylye portion), archdeaconry of Sarum and diocese of Salisbury; Shrewton, Rollstone and Maddington form one town, with three churches. The church of St. Mary is an ancient structure of flint and stone, in the Early English style, with Late Perpendicular additions, consisting of chancel, nave of five bays, south aisle, transept, north porch, and embattled western tower, with pinnacles containing 3 bells: the nave was restored and repewed in 1846 and the chancel rebuilt in 1852: the east and two other windows are stained: there are 218 sittings. The register dates from the year 1651. The living is a vicarage, united to that of Shrewton by Order in Council in 1870, net yearly value £237, with 30 acres of glebe, and residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Salisbury, and held since 1901 by the Rev. John Malcolm Alexander Graham M.A. of Brasenose College, Oxford. The Tooker and Woodroffe charities amount to £7 11s. 6d. yearly. Here are two cottages, built to replace some destroyed by the flood of 1841; the rents are annually distributed by the trustees. E. T. Hooley esq. who is lord of the manor, and Mrs. Ernle-Erle Drax, of Charborough Park, J. Barrington, R. Shackell and John Ingram Esgrs. are the principal landowners. The soil is a light loam on chalk; subsoil, chalk. The chief crops are wheat, barley and oats. The population in 1901 was 343.
