Manningford Bohun



MANNINGFORD BOHUN is a parish 2.5 miles south-east from Woodborough station on the Berks & Hants extension branch of the Great Western railway, 3 south-west from Pewsey and 9.5 east from Devizes, in the Eastern division of the county, Swanborough hundred, petty sessional division of Everleigh and Pewsey, Pewsey union, Marlborough county court district, rural deanery of Potterne, (Enford portion), archdeaconry of Wilts and diocese of Salisbury. The church of All Saints is a building of stone in the Early English style, consisting of chancel, nave, south porch, and a western turret containing one bell: there are 3 stained windows and 154 sittings. The living is chapelry, annexed to that of Wilsford, joint net yearly value £205, including 2 acres of glebe, with residence, in the gift of the master of St Nicholas' Hospital, Salsbury, and held since 1881 by the Rev. William Wrixon Keating MA of Trinity College, Dublin, who resides at Wilsford. Here are two Particular Baptist chapels, one built in 1809 and seating 70, and the other built in 1842 with 50 sittings. The Earl of Normanton is lord of the manor, and the principal landowner. The soil is clay and chalky, sub-soil, chalk and greensand: the chief crops are wheat, barley oats, beans and roots. The area is 1301 acres; rateable value £1595: the population in 1911 was 215.

Letters through Pewsey, Wilts arrive at 7am & 3pm. The nearest money order and telegraph office is at Manningford Bruce.

Wall Letter Box, Cross roads, cleared at 11.10am & 6.55pm, Sunday, 10.55am.
