



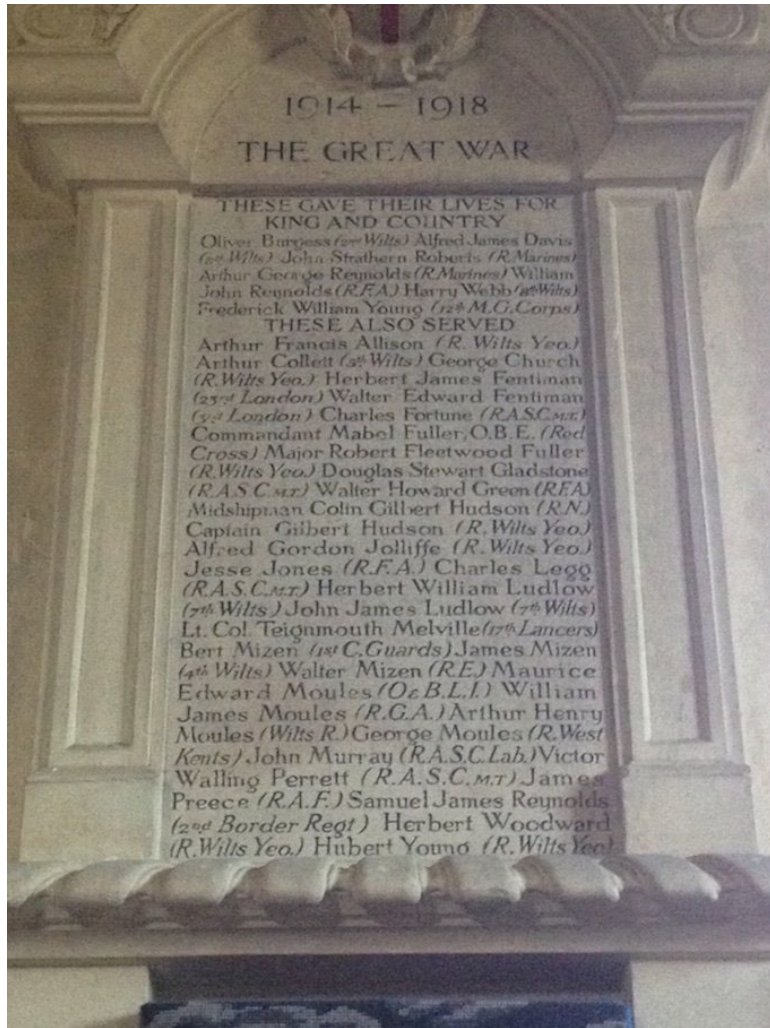


WWI Names panel on Atworth War Memorial
