One of the sufferers by the late fatal collision on the Buckinghamshire Railway, was Mr. Edward Jones, horse-dealer, of Marlborough. The case was attended with peculiar distressing circumstances. A letter was received by his wife on Wednesday morning, to the effect that if she did not immediately go to her husband she would never see him again alive. Mrs. Jones had been confined only three days, consequently it was impossible she could travel, and her distress of mind may more readily be imagined than described. Providentially, however, the injuries sustained proved to be less serious than at first supposed, and it is hoped that in a short time he will be able to return home.
