

## Father and Daughter Remanded for Receiving Stolen Goods

Stephen Slade of Marlborough, and Catherine his daughter, were charged before Mr W Lucy, Mayor, with receiving 1lb of bacon, 2 lb of flour, 3lb of suet and a new leathern apron, the property of Mr J Bond, parchment manufacturer, knowing the same to be stolen. The prisoners in answer to questions to show cause why they should not be remanded, stated that it was a hard case for them, for where they had had one shilling's worth of Mr Bond's property Mrs ------, naming a person, had had a pound's worth. If the prisoners' statement turns out to be true, a regular system of thieving must have been carried on. The prisoners were remanded.
