In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost into the ffaith of which ever blessed Trinity I was Baptized and in the constant profession of which I resolve thro' God's grace to live and die hoping for Eternal Salvation through the alone merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ I Cornelius Yeate Vicar of St Mary's in Marlborough ....deacon(?) of Wilts being in competent health of Body but always mindful of my mortality Do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament with respect to that portion of worldly Goods wherewith he hath blessed me in manner and form following ffirst I give and bequeath to the Library in St Mary's in Malburgh Pool's Synopsis Criticorum together with all my .....Chizing Notes if they shall be thought fit to be preserved Item I give to my deare Sister Alice Gold of Campden in the County of Gloucester Widow the sume of ffive pounds And to each of her Children fforty shillings apeice To the Daughter of my Brother John Yeate I give the sume of Ten Pounds to be deposited into the hands of Dr Jephcott of Evesham for her use and delivered to her in such proportions as he shall think requisite To all other my Nephews and Nieces I give ffive shillings apeice To each of my Godchildren I give the Reform's Devotion published by Dr Hicks I likewise give and bequeath to my dear and loving Mother in Law Mrs Dorothy Davers and to my Brother Mr William Davers and to each of my Sisters Mrs Ann Mrs Dorothy Mrs Margaret and Mrs Alice Davers Twenty shillings apeice to buy them a Mourning Ring As also the like sume for the same use to my dear and loveing ffreind Mrs Jane Brown of Cottley All other my goods chattles and credits not hereby disposed of I give and bequeath to my dear and loving Wife Lucie Yeate whom I make and appoint sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament Revoking all other Wills I publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament this Third day of November Anno Dom 1705 *Cor: Yeate* Signed Sealed published and declared in the presence of us *Lewis Morse Willm ffifield*
