Marston Maisey



MARSTON MAISEY is a parish near the Thames and Severn canal, on the Gloucestershire border, 3 miles north-east from Cricklade, in the Northern division of the county, hundred of Highworth, petty sessional division of Cricklade, Cricklade and Wootton Bassett union, county court district of Cirencester, rural deanery of Fairford, archdeaconry of Cirencester and diocese of Gloucester and Bristol. The church of St. James (consecrated in 1876) is a stone building, in the Early English style, consisting of chancel and nave, with small western bell turret containing one bell: the east and western windows are stained: there are 120 sittings. The first entry in the register is in the year 1742, the previous register being included in that of Meysey Hampton. The living is a vicarage, gross yearly value £70, from 25 acres of glebe, with residence, in the gift of the rector of Meysey Hampton, and held since 1882 by the Rev. Hinton Castle Smith, M.A. of Wadham College, Oxford. The charities amount to £10 yearly, and are distributed to the second poor of the parish. John Archer esq. is lord of the manor, and the principal landowners are John Archer esq., John Rickards esq. and Mrs. Bulley. The soil is gravel; subsoil, gravel. The chief crops are grass, wheat, barley and roots. The area is 1,334 acres; rateable value, £1,824; the population in 1881 was 185.
