

Lad Steals 2 Hens Eggs

Salisbury - County Petty Sessions, Tuesday before Earl Radnor and a full Bench.

William Delicate, a lad, was charged with stealing two hen's eggs, the property of his master, Mr T.B. Sutton, of Martin. Mr Nodder appeared for the prosecution. A little girl named Harriet Dyer, who was set to watch prosecutor's eggs said she saw the defendant take two eggs from one of the nests and kick the nest over. When charged with the offence, he said that he could "do" a month for it if they could prove it. He was sentenced to that term of imprisonment.

He was then charged with assaulting Jane Foster, a witness in the last case. For this offence, he was fined 10s and costs; or 14 days' imprisonment.
