FOSTER-PARENTS & EVACUEES

The Evacuation Committee of the Melksham Urban District Council are greatly concerned by the receipt of a report that unaccompanied evacuee children are handed letters by foster-parents for delivery to their parents when returning to the Evacuation Areas for a short holiday (which is sometimes done for the convenience of the householders) informing them that the evacuees are not to be returned to the reception area until other accommodation is found for them.

The Committee point out that this practice, which would appear to be increasing, is entirely contrary to the regulations affecting the Government Evacuation Scheme, and that in future cases brought to their notice they will not hesitate in taking the necessary action with a view to the imposition of appropriate penalties.
