



MERE UNION

PERSONS desirous of CONTRACTING with the GUARDIANS of this UNION for supplying the UNION HOUSE for three months, from the 25th of March instant, with Bread, Flour, Oatmeal, Meat, Bacon, Boiling Peas, Grocery, Cheese, Butter, Coals, Soap, Candles, Leather, and other articles of consumption and clothing worn by paupers, to be enumerated in the Tender, stating price and quality of each article distinct; and also such Bread as may be required by the Relieving Officer for the above period, are requested to deliver Tenders (sealed) at my Office, on or before ten o'clock in the forenoon of Tuesday, the 23rd instant, after which hours none will be received.

The Bread to be best seconds, at per loaf of 4lbs.: Flour, best seconds, at per bag.

The Bread to be delivered at the Workhouse, and at the several parishes in the Union, in such quantities, at such times, and in such manner as the Master of the said Union House and Relieving Officer shall direct. – Samples will be required to be produced.

The Guardians will not pledge themselves to accept the lowest tender; and security to be given, if required.

All Bills on the Union to be delivered (free of expense) at my office on or before the 20th instant.
