**1801**

Died. At Wexford, Ireland, Mrs Phayre, wife of Robt. Phayre, esq., late captain in the Wilts Militia.

**1803**

Married. Capt Alley, of the Wilts Militia, to Miss Page, eldest dau. of Wm Page, esq., of Gosport.

**1804**

Births. At Ryde, Isle of Wight, the lady of Capt. Atty, of the Wilts Militia, two daughters. **Bath Chronicle and Weekly Gazette, 7 June 1804**

**1805**

Marriage. Lieut. C. Malner, of the 1st Wilts Militia, to Miss Dando, of Bristol. **Bath Chronicle and Weekly Gazette, 14 February 1805**

**1812**

Marriage. On Monday week, at Liverpool, Mr John Maule(?), surgeon of the Wilts Militia, to Catharine Butler(?), youngest daughter of the late Mr J. F.(?) Butler (?), merchant, Liverpool. **Manchester Mercury, 17 November 1812**

**1826**

Sunday the 3rd inst., died, in his 74th year, at his house in Oakhampton Terrace, William Cockell, Esq., formerly paymaster in the Wilts Militia. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal 11 December 1826**

**1832**

September 2, at his residence, Brunswick Terrace, aged 46, R. C. Kellow, esq. youngest son of the Rev. Charles Thomas Kellow, of Codford St. Peter, Wilts, and late Captain of the Wiltshire Militia. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, Thursday, 13 September 1832**

**1840**

Died. Jan 12, at Bulidge House, Allington, aged 76, Capt. John Ames, on the Staff of the Wilts Militia. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 23 January 1840**

**1842**

On the 17th inst., at Marlborough, suddenly, John Maule, Esq., M.D. surgeon of the Royal Wilts Militia, aged 62 years. **Reading Mercury, 23 July 1842**

**1846**

April 3, at Swindon, awfully sudden, Thomas Villett, Esq., a magistrate for Wiltshire, and Colonel of the Wilts Militia. **Bath Chronicle and Weekly Gazette, 16 April 1846**

**1847**

On the 2nd inst., aged 20, at Newbury, Berks, of a rapid consumption, Susan Jane, the elder and beloved daughter of Wm Tucker, esq., M.D., surgeon to the Royal Wilts Militia. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 5 Aug 1847**

Died, in his 74th year, Harrington Willis, Esq., of Tostock, Norfolk, formerly Captain in the Wilts Militia. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 9 November 1847**
