Lieut. Robert Walpole Dudley, of the Wilts Militia, having been found guilty by a court-martial of endeavouring to promote quarrels between several officers of the regiment, particularly between Lieut. Cockell, Lieut. Anderson, and Lieut. Bloxham, and of damning the whole regiment, is dismissed from the service. **Reading Mercury 8 October 1798**
