OPC Note.

One interesting section of the Will is

"My will and meaning is that my said several Grand Nephews and the heirs male of their respective body and bodies as and when they shall respectively become devised and in actual possession of the said devised Estates hereditaments and premises under the several devises hereinbefore made to or for their benefit that they shall each of them in succession and due order and course use assume and take upon himself and themselves the Sirname and also bear and use and use the name of Keene only or by adding the Sirname of Keene to his and their Sirnames and shall also come and reside in the parish of Minety aforesaid"

Other than the above section, The Will and Codicil, the originals of which extend to 30+ sides of paper, have not been transcribed.
