At some point between the 1881 census and emigrating to Australia in 1909, Edward Howard was working as a seaman.	
In 1909 Edward Howard boarded the Osterley sailing from London to Sydney Australia via Fremantle, Western Australia.	
Probate was granted to Elizabeth Jane Hunt, widow of Berowra, New South Wales, Australia on 10th December 1917. Estate vale of £489 15s 4d. Edward leaves his estate to be divided between his 4 surviving sisters.
