Herbert joined the army in 1916 first with the Wiltshire Regiment then transferred to the Welsh Regiment. His service number whilst with the Wiltshire regiment was Private 4735										
He was wounded on 21st July 1917 and died the following day just north of Ypres probably as the 13th Welsh prepared for the Third Battle of Ypres										
Herbert was awarded the British War Medal and the Victory Medal
