Norton Coleparle

NORTON is a small village in the Chippenham Division of Wilts, Union, Petty Sessional Division and County Court District of Malmesbury, and Diocese of Bristol, and is distant 4 miles from Malmesbury and about 8 from Chippenham. The register of the Church of All Saints dates from 1663. The living, a vicarage, net yearly value £67, is in the gift of Sir Audley Neeld, Bart., C.B., M.V.O. The principle landowners are Col. W. H. Haydon and Col. W. W. Turnor. Area, 923 acres; rateable value, £781; population in 1921, 89. Letters through Malmesbury arrive by foot. There is a Post Office in the village, and the nearest Telegraph Office is at Hullavington, about 1½ miles distant. The letter box is cleared at 9.45 a.m. and 6.20 p.m.
