Funeral Of The Late Sir Augustus Stephenson

The funeral of the late Sir Augustus Stephenson, K.C.B., K.C., took place at Nunton Church on Friday, in the presence of relatives and friends of the deceased. The coffin was placed in the chancel, and was covered with a number of beautiful floral tributes. It bore the following inscription: - "Augustus Keppel Stephenson; born 27th October 1827; died 26th September 1994." The opening sentences of the Burial Service were read by the Rev. A.F. Kingscote, curate of Nunton, and the Lesson by the Rev. Arthur Cowie, rector of Clewer, Windsor. The hymns were " God of the Living" and "O God, Our Help In Ages Past." At the graveside the service was read by Canon the Hon. B. Pleydell Bouverie, rector of Pewsey. The Rev. R. G. Plumptre, vicar of Downton, presided at the organ. There were numerous beautiful floral tributes.
