## Captain John Challenger Murray

Captain John Challenger Murray (44) of Oaksey Manor, who died in London on Friday, was buried yesterday at Oaksey.

Elder son of the late Sir John Murray of Edinburgh, he leaves a widow and three sons, and was, until ill-health forced him to resign last month, president of Kemble and District branch of the British Legion.

Representatives of that body, in the charge of Capt Foyle Fawcett, formed a guard of honour at Oaksey parish church yesterday.

The service, with Mrs Martin at the organ, was conducted by Canon Sole, rector of Crudwell, and the Rev T J V Williams, rector of Oaksey.
