



# Kellys Directory Extract 1915



## Oaksey

**OAKSEY** is a village and parish 2.25 miles south from Kemble junction station on the Swindon and Gloucester section of the Great Western railway, and 6 north-east from Malmesbury and 7 south-west from Cirencester, in the North Western division of the county, Malmesbury hundred, petty sessional division, county court district and union, and in Malmesbury rural deanery, North Wilts archdeaconry and Bristol diocese. The church of All Saints is a building of stone in the Early English and Perpendicular styles, consisting of chancel, nave of three bays with clerestory, south aisle, north porch, and an embattled western tower containing a clock and 6 bells: the east window is stained: the south porch has been closed up, and is now used as a baptistery; there is some stained glass in the nave: the church affords 400 sittings. The register dates from the year 1667. The living is rectory, net income £282, with residence, and 21 acres of glebe, in the gift of Joseph Randolph Randolph esq. of East Court, Malmesbury, and held since 1890 by the Rev. Wyndham James Hamilton Faithfull BA of Trinity College, Cambridge. There is a small Primitive Methodist chapel. A charity of about £3 yearly is divided every other year between the second poor. Lawrence James Baker esq. JP is lord of the manor and principal landowner. The soil is clay, gravel and flint. The land is chiefly in pasture. The area is 1820 acres of land and 7 of water; rateable value £3358: population in 1911, 362.

**Woodlands** is 1 mile west-by-north.
