Oaksey

SITUATED in the Chippenham Division of Wilts, Petty Sessional Division, Union and County Court District of Malmesbury, and Diocese of Bristol, Oaksey is 3 miles from Kemble Junction Station, 6 from Malmesbury, and 7 from Cirencester. The register of the Church of All Saints dates from the year 1667; and the living, a rectory, net income £270, with residence and 21 acres of glebe, is in the gift of Judge J. R. Randolph, K.C. There is a school for 70 children, and the Primitive Methodists have a small chapel. Area, 1,827 acres; rateable value £2,236; population in 1921, 308. The parish has its own public water supply. Letters arrive through Swindon, and are despatched at 3.30 and 7.30 p.m. There is a Telegraph and Money Order Office and a public Call Office, and Postal Orders are issued and paid. WOODLANDS is 1 mile west by north.
