**This is the Last Will and Testament** of me Mary Oatridge of the parish of Oaksey in the County of Wilts, Widow. I give and bequeath all my Property Estate and Effects of what nature or kind so ever after payment of my debts funeral and testimonial expenses unto my seven children John Oatridge Rachael Horrod Sarah Oatridge Mary Dix Elizabeth Oatridge Richard Oatridge and Robert Oatridge equally to be divided between and among them share and share alike and I appoint my said son John Oatridge and my kinsman William Stevens the younger of Cirencester in the County of Gloucester Executors of this my Will hereby revoking all former Wills by me made. In Witness whereof I the said testatrix have hereunto set my hand and seal the twenty fourth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and twenty five
