



1752- Died

Last Thursday evening died, after a long and tedious indisposition, at her house at Mitcham in Surrey, in the 67th year of her age, Mrs **Phoebe Grubbe**, Relict of **William Grubbe**, late of Pottern in Wilts esq., and daughter of Mr Laurence Parker, late of the Borough of Southwark, Salter. ---- She was a Gentlewoman of exemplary piety, and extensive charity; a sincere friend and a kind relation. Her piety appeared not only in a constant, regular and devout attendance on all the duties and offices of Religion in the time of her health. But more eminently in her deportment under her last illness, which though a very long visitation, and attended with very afflicting circumstances, yet she bore it with great patience, and perfect resignation to the divine will. Her constant recourse for support under this severe affliction was to the aids and assistance of Religion, from whence she drew such comforts, as made her not only patient and resign'd, but, to a surprizing degree, easy and chearful under it. Her charity was likewise visible as well in other laudable instances, as in the many acts of it towards the Poor objects in the parish where she resided, to whom on every occasion she liberally extended her benevolence; which, together with many other valuable qualities which she possessed, makes her death, though great gain to herself, a loss to be much regretted, not only by the Poor, but by all who had the pleasure of her acquaintance.
