BROOKE, ANTHONY WILLIAM - Lieutenant 72377 - Royal Army Service Corps attached to 170 Light Field Ambulance, Royal Army Medical Corps - died 28th March 1941 - age 26 - son of William de Leighton and Theresa Caroline Brooke of Potterne - Buried at Keren War Cemetery, Eritrea - Grave/Memorial Reference - 1. D. 13.

FISHLOCK, HUBERT LAWRENCE DUNFORD - Able Seaman P/JX334903 - Royal Navy - H.M.S. President III - died 8th March 1943 - age 21 - son of George and Annie Elizabeth Fishlock of Potterne - Commemorated on the Portsmouth Naval Memorial, The Esplanade, Southsea, Portsmouth, Hampshire - Grave/Memorial Reference - Panel 74. Column 2.

HAMPTON, GODFREY ROY - Driver T/14716268 - Royal Army Service Corps - died 6th December 1947 - Buried at Potterne New Cemetery, Potterne - Grave/Memorial Reference - Grave 254.

MONTAGU, GEORGE WROUGHTON - Squadron Leader/Pilot 26241 - Royal Air Force - died 21st December 1940 - Buried at Bayeux War Cemetery, Calvados, France - Grave/Memorial Reference - XXIX. G. 18.

REVELL, ARTHUR CHARLES EDWARD - Stoker 1st Class P/KX95916 - Royal Navy - H.M.S. Laforey - vessel was lost at Nettuno off the Italian coast - died 30th March 1944 - age 24 - son of W. G. and Mary Ann Revell of Potterne -Commemorated on the Portsmouth Naval Memorial, The Esplanade, Southsea, Portsmouth, Hampshire - Grave/Memorial Reference - Panel 86. Column 1

RUDMAN, PERCY - Signalman 14543636 - 2 Line of Communications Signallers, Royal Corps of Signals - died 27th January 1944 - Buried at Potterne New Cemetery, Potterne - Grave/Memorial Reference - C. of E. Grave 273

TILLEY, HARRY CLELFORD - Leading Seaman D/JX194882 - Royal Navy - H.M.S. President III - died 12th May 1942 - Buried at Potterne New Cemetery, Potterne - Grave/Memorial Reference - C. of E. Grave 157

WATTS, HARRY EDWARD CECIL - Sapper 1990795 - 723 Artisan Works Company, Royal Engineers - died 12th July 1941 - son of Albert and Dora Sophia Watts of Potterne - Buried at Potterne New Cemetery, Potterne - Grave/Memorial Reference - Chapel Ground. Grave 340

WATTS, HERBERT - Private - served 1939-1945 - Named in a list found at the WSHO, however there are no defining criteria to establish this casualty within the Commonwealth War Graves Commission Registers

WILLIAMS, ALBERT JOHN - Private - served 1939-1945 - Named in a list found at the WSHO, however there are no defining criteria to establish this casualty within the Commonwealth War Graves Commission Registers

WILTSHIRE, HERBERT STUART - Pilot Officer/Wireless Operator/Air Gunner 176122 - Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve - died 26th August 1944 - age 23 - son of Herbert Charles and Winifred Muriel Rose Wiltshire; husband of Patricia Minnie Wiltshire of Atworth - Buried at Dely Ibrahim War Cemetery, Algeria -Grave/Memorial Reference - 3. B. 3.

WORSDELL, HERBERT JAMES - Sergeant 5566675 - 9175. Fire Fighting Section, Pioneer Corps - died 4th August 1943 - age 35 - son of Frank and Edith Worsdell; husband of Ellen Worsdell of Gosport, Hampshire - Commemorated on the Brookwood Memorial, Brookwood Military Cemetery, Pirbright, Surrey -Grave/Memorial Reference - Panel 20. Column 3
