The Brewery Plant, which is in excellent condition, comprises a well erected Copper for 200 gallons, a five quarter Mashing tub, with lead Underback, 2 large Coollers, wort and liquor pumps, 70 barrels of well brewed Strong Beer, fir for immediate consumption; six store Pieces, containing 6 barrels, 14, 15. 18, 20, and 21 barrels each; 50 Butts, Hogsheads, Barrels and Kilderkins, wort and liquor Pumps, a capital crushing hand malt mill, one horse and hand Dray or Trucks, spring Cart and Harness, one horse cart, a capital well known Mare, for saddle and harness; Bridle, Saddle, 7c.; a small quantity of Hops, 25 qrs.
