NOTICE IS HEREBU GIVEN

THAT the Trustees named and appointed in and by a certain Act of Parliament, made and passed in the thirty-seventh year of the reign of his present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for completing, widening, and keeping in repair the road from West Lavington, unto and through the town of Devizes, to the house known by the name of the "Green Man", in Seend, in the county of Wilts; and from Rowd Ford through the Devizes Market Place, to join the Beckhampton turnpike road, near Wanfdyke; and from the east end of the Devizes aforesaid to the top of Redhone Hill, in the said county of Wilts," will, at the next Meeting, to be holden at the Black Bear Inn, in Devizes, on Wednesday the 11th day of September next, at one o'clock in the afternoon, LETT TO FARM, for a term not less than one year, commencing from the 10th day of October next, the TOLLS arising from the following Gates; and that the same will be put up at the several sums following, being the sums which the said Tolls will have produced in the year then next preceding, clear of all expences of collecting the same (that is to say)
