Salisbury's Book of Remembrance

This book is housed in St. Thomas Church, Salisbury.

There are two versions of the Book of Remembrance in the church. The main book is housed in a glass topped case to enable us to remember that wars and conflicts claimed the lies of men and women from Salisbury throughout the year.

The second book is to enable research about these brave men and women who died in the service of their country.

In order to be included in the database for the book, eligibility criteria had to be set out. The names that have been included have been selected by the use of the current map of Salisbury showing the ward boundaries, the records on the War Memorial in the Market Square and those in Salisbury Cathedral. The map of Salisbury used in compiling the book can be found in the book itself.

Inevitably, the data is not complete and will be updated as more accurate information is made available, especially about those conflicts that have occurred since WWII.
