Presentment before the Quarter Sessions held in Salisbury, 11 July 1673, that Denny appeared and produced a certificate confirming that he had received the sacrament of the Lord's Supper, sworn the oaths of allegiance and supremacy and subscribed to the declaration against transubstantiation, signed by William Howes, clerk, parson of New Sarum. Letters testimonial signed by John Betts, M. D., and James Corsellis, medic, London, [1674], annotated with fiat of Kenelme Digby, surrogate, 11 April 1674; commission, 14 Jan. 1674, executed and returned, with subscription, by Henry Cox, rector of Boscombe, and Joseph Kelsey, rector of Newton Toney, Wilts., 26 Jan 1674: VX 1A/10/57/1-4. Licensed to practise medicine in the dioceses of Bath and Wells, Bristol, Exeter, Salisbury and Winchester, 11 April 1674: Sheldon, f.250v
