**1814**

Death At Salisbury, Jane, second daughter of the Rev. Dr. Price, canon residentiary of the cathedral, 20. **New Monthly Magazine, 1814, January to June, Vol. 1, 1 May 1814**

**1818**

On Tuesday the 3rd inst. died at her son's seat, Hedingham Castle, Mrs. Majendie, relict of the late Dr. Majendie, Canon of Windsor, Prebendary of Worcester and of this Cathedral, Salisbury and Preceptor to the Queen; mother of the Bishop of Bangor, and aunt to Dr. Prevost, Vicar of Tisbury. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 16 February 1818**

**1823**

Married Yesterday at St. Thomas's Church, Salisbury, Captain Roberts, R.N. to Miss Wyndham of the Close. They were attended to the altar by William Wyndham, Esq of Dinton, brother to the lady and by all the members of that most respectable family. The happy pair afterwards set off for Clifden to spend the honeymoon. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, Thursday, 6 February 1823**

**1827**

On Monday last died in the Close, Miss Kerrich, daughter of the late Rev. Walter Kerrich, Canon Residentiary of our Cathedral. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 12 March 1827**

On Thursday last died, of a decline, in the 22nd year of her age, Mary Ann, the eldest and sincerely lamented daughter of Mr. J. T. Biddlecombe, of the Close, of this city. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 12 March 1827**

**1835**

Died October 13, at his residence, in the Close, Salisbury, Wadham Wyndham, Esq.; 3rd son of the late William Wyndham, Esq.; and brother to William Wyndham, Esq. of Dinton, Wilts. **Bath Chronicle and Weekly Gazette, 22 October 1835**

**1838**

Married      October 4, at the Cathedral, by the Rev. J. Greenly, Mr. Richard Andrews, of Dinton, butcher, to Miss Jane Viney, of the Close, Salisbury.      **Wiltshire Independent, Thursday, 11 October 1838**

**1846**

Died.      April 11th, Fanny, the wife of the Rev. Eardley Wilmot, vicar of Kenilworth, and last surviving daughter of the late Rev. Charles Elkins, Canon of Salisbury      **Devizes & Wiltshire Gazette, Thursday, 16 April 1846**
