MARRIAGE OF THE BISHOPS HOUSEKEEPER. On Saturday last, Ann Carr, housekeeper to the Bishop of Salisbury, was married to Mr. Thomas Brussey, of London, by the Lord Bishop, assisted by Rev. Chancellor Daubeny, about half-past nine, before the service. After the ceremony the party returned to the palace, and sat down to a splendid breakfast provided by the Bishop. The bride and bridegroom left for Bournemouth at half-past one. The wedding party took a visit to Stonehenge, and spent a very enjoyable day. The bride had been in the Bishop's service some years and much regret was felt at her leaving.
