



Sarum and Ealing Turnpike

WHEREAS it hath been represented to the Trustees under this Act that the payment of full tolls has been frequently evaded by the taking off an horse or horses, drawing carriages on this turnpike, before they come to the turnpike gates; and also by passing off the road, and using other fraudulent means to avoid payment of the tolls: notice is hereby given, that all persons offending, will be prosecuted according to law; and the gatekeepers and other persons employed on the road are directed to be attentive for the discovery and conviction of such offenders; and for neglect thereof, they will be discharged from their employment.
