## Seagry

THIS village is 2 miles from Great Somerford Station (G.W.R), 5 from Malmesbury, and 6 from Chippenham, and is in the Chippenham Division of Wilts Petty Sessional Division, Union and County Court District of Chippenham, and Diocese of Bristol. The register of the Church of St. Mary dates from 1600, and the living is a vicarage of the net value of £102, with residence, in the gift of the Earl of Carnarvon. The chief landowner is Earl Cowley. Area, 1.083 acres; rateable value, £2,045; population, 215. :Letters arrive from Chippenham, and are despatched at 7.10 p.m. The nearest Money Order and Telegraph Office is at Sutton Benger. There is a Telephone Exchange at Seagry. Postal orders are issued and paid here.
