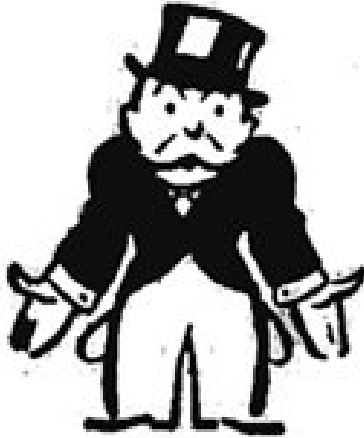


Bankruptcies



Adjudication

Ronald William Spurgeon of Seend Cleeve, Wilts, haulage contractor.

Western Daily Press Wednesday 8 February 1933

The first meeting of creditors of Ronald William Spurgeon, haulage contractor of Coryton, Seend Cleeve, Wiltshire, was held at the Official Receiver's Office, Baldwin Street, Bristol, yesterday before the Official Receiver (Mr J D Turner).

The statement of affairs showed that the liabilities amounted to £447 and the deficiency to £392.

Causes of failure, as stated by the debtor, were heavy initial expenses on commencing business and not having any capital; unreliable transport service by sub-contractors and consequent loss of trade; further loss of trade owing to accident to motor lorry and being unable to use it for six weeks, and claims through loss of goods in transit.

It was in May 1932 that the debtor commenced business.

The Official receiver remains trustee.

The following bankruptcy notice was published in last night's "London Gazette"

Order annulled, Ronald William Spurgeon, Coryton, Seend Cleeve, Wilts, Haulage contractor. Receiving order dated February 1 1933 rescinded and adjudication of February 1 1933 annulled and petition filed February 1 1933 dismissed, all on March 1 1948, all debts being paid in full.
