

A Second Liberal Candidate for North Wilts

Mr. J.T. Schomberg, of Seend, near Melksham, has announced himself as a candidate for the representation of the Northern Division of Wilts, in the Liberal interest. The basis of his political opinions is "Civil and religious liberty," and he is in favour of the repeal of the malt tax. He desires the disestablishment of the Irish Church, but is opposed to the ballot. The Wilts Independent informs us that Mr. Schomberg's family has been settled in the neighbourhood of Melksham for upwards of seventy years. Mr. Schomberg is the youngest brother of the late Mr. Henry Charles Schomberg, of Wans House, on whose death he succeeded to that property, which he subsequently sold to the present occupier, Captain Wyndham.
