



Died Nov 13 at Seend, Wilts George Cranmer Kenrick, esq, aged 63 **Exeter and Plymouth Gazette**

Many of our readers will have heard with regret of the death of G C Kenrick, esq. Early in his professional life, Mr Kenrick settled as a medical man in Melksham, where for years he had a leading practice, and was respected and beloved, not only as a skilful practitioner, but as a very kind and courteous gentleman. He was in a special manner the friend of the poor, and while all who lived on terms of intimacy with him will miss him; his poorer neighbours will feel that they have lost one who, while he was able, and even beyond his strength, went among them with unceasing tenderness and sympathy. Failing health obliged him to give up his practice, and he resided latterly at Seend, where he died calmly, having borne a long and painful illness without a murmur. He was buried on Saturday in Seend churchyard.
