SEEND NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Nottingam Knockers: The Devizes Police have warned us that a gang known as the 'Nottingham Knockers' have been going door to door in Marlborough and Devizes and other local villages. They get dropped off and usually sell dusters, towels, etc from large shoulder bags. Some are known to have criminal records. They are also thought to be casing the area for future criminal activities. Where it appears that a house is unoccupied or people are on holiday, their doors or gateposts are marked with a cross and other signs to signify that there are valuable goods inside and whether a house is alarmed or not. Pavements are also sometimes marked.

Credit Card Scam: The editorial team have also heard of a telephone scam involving your credit card. Calls are made from people claiming to be from the security and fraud department of your credit card company. They claim that there has been an attempt to use your card to purchase a certain item. When you say that you have not made that purchase, they then go through various security checks. Their aim ultimately is to get the 3-digit security number on the back of your card. Once they have this, they are then able to make purchases over the internet and phone using your card. Your real credit card company would already have this information. So please be wary of any such phone calls and check yourself with your credit card company for legitimacy before giving any information away.

New Neighbourhood Watch signs: People may have observed 10 new signs around the village, mainly displayed on telegraph poles. Two of them are not displayed correctly but they will be corrected shortly.
