In the name of God Amen the second day of August Ano Domini 1602, and in the fortyfourth year of the Raigne our Sovereigne lady queen Elizabeth by the grace of god of England ffranc and Ireland William Browne alias Clement the elder of Semlie in the County of Wilts husbandman being sicke in Body but sound in minde and of A good and a perfite remembrance praise be unto God therefore doe make this my last will and testament in manner and forme following ffirst I commend my Soule into the hands of God, hoping only too be Saved by his mercy and by noo other meanes whatsoever my body to be buried in the parish churchyard of Semlie and my goods to be disposed as followeth I give to my too Daughters Mary and Susanna ten pound a piec to be paie when they shalle come to the age of twelve years Allso I give to my Daughter A..... a calfe that is already weaned All my other good nott given now bequeathed I give too my wife Elizabeth whom I doo ordainne full and whole Executor of this my last will and testament Allso I do ordain John goddard of Dunhead Mary and Thomas Blanford the younger overseers of this my last will and testament This was don in the presence of Thomas Lawrence Sybyll wild widdowe and Ellen Browne widdowe
