The poor girl, in a very short time after, complained of a violent pain in her stomach, and was swelled to a great degree; she now continues very ill, and it is feared will not recover. Very fortunately the rest of the family, six in number, ate little or none of the broth, complaining that there was an odd saltish taste in it, and by that means, in all probability, have saved their lives.
