



CORONERS INQUESTS



South Newton

Frederick Goodfellow

An inquest was held by Mr Wilson, on Tuesday, at South Newton, on the body of Frederick Goodfellow, aged 4 years, who was drowned in the river there on the previous day. It appeared from the evidence of his brother, Thomas Goodfellow, aged 8 years, that the deceased was on a bridge known as "Bonham's Bridge," leading from South Newton to Wishford, about a quarter to four o'clock, in company with another brother named John, when by some means he fell into the stream and was drowned. The father of the deceased stated that the bridge is in very bad repair, and dangerous for people to pass over. Verdict, "Accidental death."
