



History of the Primitive Methodist Chapel

The souvenir Official Handbook of the Brinkworth and Swindon Centenary District Synod held in 1910 records that: "An iron structure was erected in 1890 which soon became too small and was sold. A new site was secured and in 1907 the present building erected with sufficient land for a new Church when the opportunity arrives. Number of sittings: 200, Number of members: 32, Total cost: £497. In 1909 there was a Sunday School Anniversary service, on the Saturday there was a public tea, Sunday service held by Rev. R J Barrett and on Monday a small concert, all monies to fund the Sunday school. *Swindon Advertiser 11-06-1909.*

Anniversary services, Sunday week when Mr. E Jones, of Swindon was the preacher. *North Wilts Herald 08-06-1917.*

Sunday School Anniversary service last Sunday lead by Mr. W. R. Robins. *North Wilts Herald 10-06-1938.*

Memorial Service for Mr. A Mulcock, caretaker for 34 years and trustee for 25 years. *North Wilts Herald 24-10-1941.*

Mr. A Rowbotham & Mr. H J Gregory lead the Remembrance services on Sunday. *North Wilts Herald 14-11-1941.*

Carol Service on Sunday, presided over by Mr. W A Falls. *North Wilts Herald 26-12-1941.*

Lay preachers Frederick Cooper 1930's, Mr Fry in 50's. Rev. Renouf 1970s.

Now the Church of God the Prophecy and from 2014 was sharing with Storehouse Pentecostal Church (rev. Dick Denyer who moved to Stratton Green in July 2015).
