

# **Kellys Directory of Wiltshire, 1889**



## Stratton St. Margaret

Stratton St Margaret is a parish and a village, taking its name from the old roman road running through it; it has a station 1½ miles from the village, on the Swindon & Cricklade branch of the Great Western Railway, 2½ miles northeast from Swindon, 79½ miles from London and 3½ south from Highworth: it was originally divided into 3 tithing's, called the street (now Lower Stratton), The Green, and Upper Stratton. And includes UPPER STRATTON with KINGSDOWN: it is in the Northern division of the county, hundred of Highworth, Swindon & Highworth union, Swindon county court district & petty session's division, and in the rural deanery of Cricklade, archdeaconry of Bristol and diocese of Gloucester and Bristol. The Wiltshire & Berks canal skirts the parish on the south. The church of St.Margaret is an ancient structure of stone, in the Early English style, supposed to have been erected in the reign of Edward I.: it consists of chancel, nave, aisles separated from the nave by arcades of four bays, south porch, and a modern square western tower containing 4 bells: the east window is decorated and stained: there are monumental tablets to William & Alice Hedges, alias Lacey de Kingsdown, 1645: Catherine Hedges, 1649 & William Hedges, 1693; also a memorial window to Mrs. Eliza E. Craig, 1882:: there are 350 sittings. The register dates from the year 1608. The living is a vicarage, yearly value £210, the Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol nominates, and Merton College, Oxford, presents, to the living: the present incumbent, the Rev. Septimus Isaac Crawhill M.A. of Magdalen College, Oxford, has held the living since 1879:: the rectorial tithe and glebe lands are in the possession of Merton College. There is an iron mission, dedicated to St. Philip. at Upper Stratton with 230 sittings. Here are Particular Baptist, General Baptist, Primitive Methodist, with Sunday schools attached. The charities are inconsiderable, being the interest of a sum of £200, bequeathed for the sustenance of vicars' widows in 1693 by Wm. Hedges: there is an endowment of £24 a year to the General Baptist chapel at Lower Stratton. Here is the Workhouse of the Highworth & Swindon union, for particulars see Swindon.. Kingsdown House, a stone building in the Elizabethan style, the seat of David Archer esq.. D.L., J.P. lord of the manor. The principal landowners are Merton College, Oxford, D. Archer esq, D.L., J.P., Thomas Day esq. and Thomas Arkell esq. The soil is principally clay loam and brash: subsoil of a loamy mixture. The chief crops are wheat, beans and barley. The area is 2,883 acres of land; ratable value £17,259: population in 1881 3,959 including 256 officers and inmates in Highworth and Swindon workhouse.

GORSE HILL is a hamlet, joining New Swindon. The names of residents are registered under New Swindon, which see; it is about to be joined to New Swindon for all purposes.

KINGSDOWN is 11/2 miles north; PENHILL 2 miles north-west
