Canadian Ray Jepson, who was badly wounded in the 1939-45 war and left disabled, had an eight-year spell in England from 1944. Then he met his wife Ruby who was a nurse at Stratton St. Margaret Hospital, and they had a baby daughter. She was only four months old when the family emigrated to Canada where they had a built-to-order home, but a nagging longing for the old country brought them back to live in Swindon.
