#### **Dedication Service**

HYMN (A. & M.) 166:

ALL people that on earth do dwell, Sing to the Lord with cheerful voice<sup>o</sup> Him serve with fear, His praise forth tell, Come ye before Him, and rejoice.

The Lord, ye know, is God indeed; Without our aid He did us make; We are His flock, He doth us feed, And for His sheep He doth us take.

O enter then His gates with praise, Approach with joy His courts unto; Praise, laud, and bless His Name always, For it is seemly so to do.

For why? the Lord our God is good; His mercy is for ever sure; His truth at all times firmly stood, And shall from age to age endure.

To Father, Son and Holy Ghost, The God Whom Heav'n and earth adore, From men and from the Angel-host Be praise and glory evermore. Amen.

Brethren, we are met together to add our prayers to the thoughts of countless multitudes, whose minds are turning at this time to one of the most sacred places in the history of our race—the Abbey Church of St. Peter at Westminster. Thither our Queen has come this day to receive from God the anointing which seals her life's service and bestows God's grace for its fulfilment, and the Crown which is the emblem of her royal state. She has come, as other Kings and Queens before her have come, for a thousand years. Each prayer, each act in the Solemn Rite, is rich in memories of the long history through which, by God's Providence, the Monarchy of this Realm has been preserved.

Yet it is no mere relic of the past. It speaks still of kingship as a trust received from God. It speaks now of the hallowing of the Queen for the service of God and of the people, not in this land only but in many lands across the seas. To-day, in a manner hitherto unknown in history, the Queen has come to her Consecration and her Crowning, accompanied by her people. For, by

a marvel of Science, millions throughout the world will be able to listen to the noble words which lay her great charge upon her as if they, themselves, were present in the Abbey Church at Westminster.

In another, and far deeper sense, she bears her people with her, for she is their representative. With her they too, are called to consecrate the life of Nation and Empire to the service of the King of Kings.

Wherefore, let us now prepare our hearts and minds that we may worthily associate ourselves with our Queen on this great

day.

#### II.—PENITENCE.

And first, as is most meet, let us make humble acknowledgment before God of the manifold ways wherein, as a people, we have come short of His Will and Purpose.

#### Let us pray:

Seek ye the Lord while He may be found, call ye upon Him while He is near: let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts, and let him return unto the Lord and He will have mercy upon him, and to our God for He will abundantly pardon.

Hide thy face from our sins; And blot out all our iniquities.

Grant, we beseech Thee, merciful Lord, to Thy faithful people pardon and peace, that they may be cleansed from all their sins and serve Thee with a quiet mind, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Almighty and everlasting God who art always more ready to hear than we to pray, and are wont to give more than either we desire or deserve. Pour down upon us the abundance of Thy mercy, forgiving us those things whereof our consciences are afraid and giving us those good things which we are not worthy to ask, but through the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord. Amen.

O Lord, our God, who upholdest and governest all things by the word of thy power: Receive our humble prayers for our Sovereign Lady Queen ELIZABETH, and as Thou dost this day set a crown of pure gold upon her head, so let wisdom be her guide, let Thine arm strengthen her, let truth and justice, holiness and righteousness, peace and charity, abound in her days; Direct all her counsels and endeavours to Thy glory, and the welfare of her subjects; give us grace to obey her cheerfully for conscience sake, and let her always possess the hearts of her people; let her reign be long and prosperous, and crown her with everlasting life in the world to come; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Almighty God, the fountain of all goodness, give ear, we beseech Thee, to our prayers, and multiply Thy blessings upon Thy servant ELIZABETH, consecrated in Thy name this day to be our Queen; defend her evermore from all dangers, ghostly and bodily; make her a great example of virtue and piety, and a blessing to this kingdom; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with Thee, O Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, world without end. *Amen*.
