Precept increase unavoidable

It is with regret that Stratton St Margaret Parish Council has to announce an increase of 2.51% to its precept following the Council Tax Base Reforms introduced by Central Government and the decision by Swindon Borough Council not to pass down any mitigation grant funding provided to it by Central Government.

The increase will add another £2.58 per annum to the average D Band property bill. The table below indicates how each property band will be affected by the parish element of your total Council Tax invoice:

The new precept of £767,633 has resulted in an increase in the D Band cost of 2.51% or £2.58 per annum with the new D Band being set at £105.52.

The precept in 2012/13 was £823,905. The Council Tax Base was 8004 and the D Band Council Tax charge was £102.94. The new tax base for 2013/14 would have been 8085.9 and had the Parish Council retained the same expenditure as it had in 2012/13, the new D Band Council Tax would have actually reduced to £101.89. The Parish Council could have passed on a £1.05 per annum saving to local residents whilst spending the same amount of money in the local community.

However, the Council Tax Base reform has resulted in a reduction of 9.1% to the Tax Base. Accordingly that has reduced the Tax Base from 8085.9 to 7274.5. The impact to Stratton St Margaret Parish Council has been a loss of £83,523 in income. Grant funding was provided by Central Government to help reduce the impact of this loss but unfortunately Swindon Borough Council has taken the decision not to pass that funding on to any of the parish councils within the Borough.

The Parish Council has made over £56,000 worth of savings which followed on from the £28,000 savings made in 2012/13 so it is a blow to the Parish Council that it has been unable to continue to reduce its precept and pass that saving on directly to local residents.

Participating budgeting initiative £200 GRANTS AVAILABLE

The Parish Council will once again be holding a participatory budgeting event at its Annual Parish Assembly on Tuesday 16th April at the Stratton Leisure Centre from 7pm. Groups and organisations operating within the Parish of Stratton St Margaret are invited to give a short presentation at the meeting where the audience will decide which groups, based on their presentation, should receive a grant.

There will be seven grants of up to £200 each to be awarded on the night by the Chairman of the Council.


Should the Groundwell/Hyde Road areas be included in the revised parish boundaries?

The Parish Council's response to the Review

Based on the results of the second consultation the Parish Council submitted the following conclusions to Swindon Borough Council:

- That the existing boundaries of Stratton St Margaret be retained with the following revisions:
- That the area at Groundwell/Hyde Road be included within the existing boundary to help create improved clarity of the parish boundary
- That the area of Stratton Wood area be included within the parish boundary
- That the area around Headlands be included within the existing boundary to help create improved clarity of the parish boundary

The response concluded that the above revisions would have a positive impact on the community governance in each area.

What happens next?

The Borough Council will:

- Consider the evidence received and publish their final recommendations for the Community Governance Review on 16th April 2013
- Make the necessary Community Governance Order in May 2013
- It is expected that changes to parish arrangements will take effect when appropriate but not before the date of the next scheduled parish elections in May 2014

The Local Plan 2026



The Swindon Borough Local Plan 2026 is the main planning policy document for the Borough. It sets out how much housing, employment and retail development Swindon Borough Council considers the Borough needs up to the year 2026 and where it should be built. The plan also sets out what infrastructure will be needed to enable development to take place.

The Plan includes policies to try to ensure that development is of the highest quality, avoids environmentally sensitive locations, respects the existing build environment and meets the needs of present and future residents.

The consultation period ended on the 21st February. Consultation meetings were held across the Borough and residents were encouraged to submit responses to the Borough Council regarding the Local Plan.

Stratton St Margaret's response

The Parish Council has submitted a response to the plan which can be downloaded from its website. Its main concerns included the number of houses being proposed in close proximity to the Parish, traffic implications, flood risk, infrastructure requirements and the lack of designation on sensitive sites such as Merton Fields and St Catherine's School playing field.

Kingsdown development

Stratton St Margaret Parish Council has strongly objected to the inclusion of the

site known as Kingsdown in the Local Plan as it feels it is a totally unacceptable proposal in an area that is essentially rural in character, and has recommended that it be deleted.

It is felt that this proposal would severely affect the character and identity of Broad Blunsdon and was not identified as an option in the Core Strategy. Broad Blunsdon should retain its independent identity from Swindon through non-coalescence. The proposal would significantly undermine that aspiration and the land between the proposed development and Blunsdon village would not be significant enough to provide adequate mitigation.

What happens next?

The Local Plan, together with the Parish Council's response and all other representations and evidence will be submitted for examination by an independent Planning Inspector. The purpose of this examination is to consider whether the Local Plan is 'legally compliant' (if it has been prepared in accordance with regulations) and is 'sound'. The Borough Council will report back on the outcome in due course.


Neighbourhood Planning
