Annual Message Chair to the Council, Councillor John Foley



This year has been quite an eventful year for this Parish!

At the beginning of the year we were informed by Swindon Borough Council that, despite the majority of the residents who took part in the consultation process wishing to stay as part of the Stratton St Margaret Parish Council, a new parish council for Nythe will be formed from May 2015. The Chair of Finance (Councillor Nigel Chalk) will explain the ramifications of this in his report.

We reinstated the Annual Stratton Festival, to celebrate the Feast Day of St Margaret and this took place over three weekends with events in Upper Stratton which were organised by the Upper Stratton Baptist Church, at Swindon RFC and the main event at the Grange Leisure Centre where over 5,000 people turned out and made it a very successful event. So many of those attending the festival asked for it to be held annually, that we decided to hold it again this year on 19 July at Grange Leisure and we hope to exceed last year's attendance figures.

There will also be other events around that time such as the very successful Stratton Stroll (editor's note: taking place on 26 July) which will take in many of the hostelries in the parish. I hope you will all attend.

This leads me on quite nicely to our grand project of upgrading the Leisure Centre, which is now over 35 years old. We decided that it was in need of a facelift and bringing up to date to meet the present day needs. We installed a new gym suite to replace the old under used squash courts, to provide a more welcoming area for the main entrance, to use the old gym suite area to provide updated accommodation for our staff in the centre of the Parish instead of the cramped area that previously housed the Council offices hidden away in Upper Stratton. We changed the Reception area into a Coffee Shop and I am pleased to say that it has been a great success. Another great success has been the All weather Grass Pitch (AGP) we installed to the rear of the building.

The AGP has been so successful that we have had to stop taking any more more bookings at present. I am sure that Councillor Chalk will expand on these later on. Suffice to say that we predict that all of our improvements will be cost negative within 4 years. Nigel will also tell you that all of the projects came in on time and on target to be on budget.

Unfortunately last September I was taken ill and spent a considerable time in the Intensive Care Unit and on Saturn Ward in the Great Western Hospital and did not see the start of the project but Councillors David Roberts, Anne and Nigel Chalk and Pat and Mike Spry stepped into the breach and took control and made sure that everything was OK.

It was at this time that the then Clerk to the Council left us by mutual consent and moved on to pastures new. We wish him well in the future.

This meant that we had to appoint a new Clerk and this took some time as we had to comply with EU regulations which meant that we had to advertise the vacancy throughout the EU. I was amazed at the number of applications that we received. In the meantime we appointed a Locum Clerk to run the day-to-day operations of the Council, and we were fortunate enough to find Mrs Tracy Predeth. After a long process of elimination Tracy was finally appointed as Clerk to the Council with effect from 1 May 2014. We wish her every success.

Finally I would like to thank David, Nigel and Anne Chalk and Pat and Mike Spry for the sterling work that they did for this council and also to thank my fellow councillors for all their support and good wishes during my illness and eventually to thank all those residents who wished me well during what was a very traumatic period.

Annual Report Chair of Finance Committee, Councillor Nigel Chalk

It gives me great pleasure to be able to say that we have managed to weather the storm. As the Chairman said we have had a few very difficult months, but have managed to keep everything going and as those of you who have had a chance, will have seen, the Grange Centre refurbishment is just about to complete.

Even in these challenging times we have managed to ensure that we have not needed to increase the precept this year. The Grange Centre was losing money and we have worked with Alliance Leisure over the last few years to put new life, into the Centre. From an annual loss, we now expect the Centre to pay for itself in the coming year.

This will help to absorb the cost, as the Chairman mentioned earlier, of losing Nythe from the Parish, a net loss of around £80k per annum. If we hadn't acted now it would have meant a major reduction in services or a precept increase of around 10%, which no-one would have wanted. In fact, the provisional year-end figures show that we managed to stay within our budgets.

In addition, we are taking on the management of 12 new green areas from Swindon Borough Council to help them meet their budget restrictions, again at no additional cost to the Stratton ratepayers.

Finally, I would like to warmly welcome our new Finance Officer, Sandra Kelly, to the fold and we are sure she will soon settle to the tasks ahead of her.

No doubt some people say that there's too much development in the Parish, but as a local Parish Council we do take note of the objections raised by the public, both in written form and those who are present at our Planning meetings - those comments are forwarded to Swindon Borough Council. Sometimes they do take note of any concerns or objections raised by those affected and sometimes they don't!

On other matters, some of you will be aware of the plans for the Peace Memorial on the corner of Ermin Street/Grange Drive. These plans are ongoing and the new memorial will be completed by 3 August this year.

As a Council we are also preparing a Neighbourhood Plan which will see us as a Parish, looking towards the future. I will now hand over to my colleague, Councillor Anne Chalk, who can enlighten you more on this matter.

Neighbourhood Planning Report

Councillor Anne Chalk

This evening Stratton St Margaret Parish Council is officially launching its Neighbourhood Plan.

You are probably asking what is a Neighbourhood Plan?

Well, it's about me, it's about you, and it affects all the residents of Stratton, but more than that it's about the future. The Localism Act, which received royal assent on 15 November 2011, introduced new rights and new powers to allow local communities to shape their own neighbourhood.

The Neighbourhood Plan gives local people the chance to decide how the area should look. You could have a say in things such as:

- Housing
- **Highways**
- Health
- Cycleways
- **Footpaths**
- **Traffic Levels**
- **Green Spaces**

Close to our hearts is creating a community green space. By asking you and finding out what your needs are we hope to be able to designate that space as a protected area and regenerate existing open spaces in the Parish.

Chair of Allotments & Cemeteries, Councillor Pat Spry

White Hart Allotment

The Council continued to support the White Hart Allotment Society and their efforts to promote National Allotment Week on this allotment site. The Meet & Greet event was postponed twice due to seriously bad weather, but eventually, on 10th August we beat the weather and a good time was had by all.

The event attracted quite a crowd, including my husband, Mike, and me. As well as viewing the growing area and appreciating the work done to produce, the vegetables and fruit, we were also asked to judge some of their produce and the efforts the gardeners made to protect their produce:- the scarecrows, then on to judge giant sunflowers; some amazing vegetables, literally all shapes and sizes!

We were also very impressed by the efforts made by the children – getting them involved when they're young is great. Of course the tea and wonderful cakes really did set the whole occasion into a class of its own! Well done to all concerned.

St Phillips Allotment

Mike and I made two visits to St. Phillips allotments this year, and have also chatted, off site, to several allotment holders. No-one raised any concerns, so it seems that all is OK, but if there are any issues of concern, a quick call to the office is all that's needed.

General

Skips will be provided again this year to assist allotment holders in disposing of waste, but there will not be any compost provided this year.

There will be an allotment competition this year, and I'm looking forward to seeing once again all the fantastic arrays of vegetables, fruit and flowers produced by our green-fingered allotmenteers.

Progress is being made with the additional site at South Marston. The development of the Gorse Hill site is delayed pending some kind of legal issue which is being progressed by Swindon Borough Council.

St Margaret Cemetery

The resurfacing work on the cemetery drive has been completed. Plot availability within the Parish is limited, which is a concern.

Green Road Cemetery

Residents will be aware that the Parish planned to refurbish the smallest Chapel in Swindon at Green Road Cemetery. Unfortunately, we've had to put this project on hold since Parish finances were cut by £85,000 by Swindon Borough Council in 2013/14 and with a further restriction to be imposed in 2014/15.

General

The Council has agreed to introduce a scheme whereby memorial benches may be adopted and leased by residents of the Parish.

Our Grounds Staff have again made sterling efforts in the past year, and I'd like to take this opportunity to thank them for making our Parish a more tidy, enjoyable and more beautiful place to live. However, the Grounds Staff are not the only ones deserving of our gratitude.

The past year has been a tumultuous one for the Council, and I want to thank all of our staff, without exception, for their support, assistance and patient understanding. In addition, we owe a debt of gratitude to former employees, who have rallied round to help out in what has been a very difficult year for the Council. My heartfelt thanks go to all concerned.

Chair of Recreation, Councillor David Roberts

I am pleased to be able to give this short address on behalf of the Recreation Committee on just some of the work carried out over the last 12 months within the Parish.

This, as you all know has been a challenging year for the weather with the grounds team battling rain from October through to February. It is a credit to the team that after all that rain the open spaces are looking in good order. It is only April but already we have carried out three grass cuts throughout the Parish.

The Parish has 14 open spaces of varying sizes and your local Parish Council continues to maintain and equip them to a high standard on a rolling programme. Since last year, under a lease agreement with Swindon Borough Council, the Parish has taken on an additional 12 open spaces. Some of these spaces

we were previously leasing from the Borough but we now have them rent-free. You may have seen the grounds team already mowing the newly adopted areas. Thanks must go to the office staff and Cllrs Mr and Mrs Chalk for overseeing the transfer of the open spaces.

Claridge's Pond on Swindon Road is one of the newly adopted sites and is one that will need a lot of work to bring it up to a good standard, having been neglected for many years.

Already with the help of Nationwide staff a considerable amount of work has been undertaken, reclaiming the paths and painting the seats. This year we will undertake a survey on all the trees with a view to pruning and we will assess the pond.

The new play area behind the
Coleview Community Centre opened
in 2013; despite the wet winter it is
proving very popular with young
people and their parents. The
grounds team will continue to develop the play area and

surrounding park through 2014.

During the last year improvement work has also been carried out on the open spaces at Stephens Road, Brooks Close and Delamare Drive. During 2014/15 we have a number of new pieces of equipment ready to install. The state of the ground has not permitted installations to date.

In last year's report I brought to your attention the vandalism that had taken place to the new noticeboards and signs. Unfortunately that has not changed and further damage has taken place. A number of the damaged items have been away for repair and are soon to be reinstalled. It saddens me also to report that nearly 30 young trees planted at Merton Fields were broken in half, in one act of vandalism, with all of them having to be replaced.

Last year I told you that the Parish Council was in the process of applying for planning permission to install an artificial grass pitch at the back of the Leisure Centre. I am pleased to report that the new pitch is up and running. The floodlit pitches have proved so popular that we have had to suspend block bookings to allow everyone the opportunity to use the new facility. This new facility is also providing a new revenue income for the Parish.

As well as cutting the grass on our open spaces, the Parish Council has contracts to cut the grass for Haydon Wick Parish Council, North Wiltshire FA and Ruskin Junior School.

> Since last year more dog bins have been installed within the Parish and now number nearly 30. We also have contracts to look after the bins in Blunsdon, Wroughton, Liddington, South Marston and Bishopstone.

With the help of the community, the Woodland Trust and local organisations, tree planting has continued throughout the year at Merton Fields, Meadowcroft, Coleview and Stephens Road. This project will be ongoing throughout the years to come.

You may have noticed over the last few weeks that the grounds team have started to clear and prepare the land at the end of Grange Drive in readiness for the installation of the new Peace Memorial for the Parish.

We continue, through a rolling programme, to update our plant and machinery and last year saw the purchase of a new hedge cutter, two

hand mowers, one ride on mower, a new water pump plus many smaller items of equipment.

With spring on its way the team is starting to get ready for the summer planting of flowers throughout the Parish. To save time and money a new irrigation system has been installed at Grange Leisure to water the plants.

Lee Plank and Clive Skinner of the grounds team are currently undertaking their NVQ in horticulture and have plans for more planting within the parish.

This is just a snapshot of the work undertaken in the last year. We must not forget the day-to-day work such as daily inspections of the play equipment, litter picking, weekly sweeping of the AGP, weed spraying, dog bin emptying etc.

Two major events took place in the Parish during the last year; the Stratton Festival and the Christmas Extravaganza. A lot of work went into staging both those events by all the Parish staff and Councillors. My own vote of thanks must go to the grounds team who helped to make these events the success they were. The look on the children's faces at Christmas when they saw the reindeer and Father Christmas was amazing!

All of this work would not have been possible without the Parish grounds staff under the leadership of Danny Mason, the Clerk to the Council and the office staff, plus fellow councillors

who sit on the Recreation Committee. On behalf of everyone in the Parish could I say a big thank you to them all. With your help we are continuing to make Stratton St Margaret a place to be proud of. This is recognised not just locally but also at national level. We are disappointed that Swindon Borough Council is unable to recognise our achievements and put politics aside and focus on what is positive for the community.

Stratton St Margaret In The Wider Community Councillor David Roberts, Vice-Chair To The Council

Stratton St Margaret Parish Council is a member of The National Association of Local Councils for England. NALC represents the interests of town and parish councils in England – a total of around 8,500 councils.

Working with, and for, member councils, NALC is actively involved in lobbying government at national level to advance and protect the interests of member councils, and their communities. NALC is committed to developing the role of town and parish councils, in order that they can represent the communities which they serve effectively, and be at the forefront of community leadership. As the representative for Stratton St Margaret Parish Council I sit on the following committees.

- 1. Wiltshire Association of Local Councils Swindon Area Committee along with Cllr Nigel Chalk.
- 2. Wiltshire Association of Local Councils, who meet at Devizes. In 2013 I was elected Chair of the Wiltshire Association.
- 3. The South West Conference of Local Councils Association who meet at Tiverton.
- 4. The National Association of Local Councils who meet in London. I sit on the following committees:
 - National Council
 - Local Larger Councils Committee
 - Policy Committee, Vice Chair
 - Sustainable Communities Advisory Board, Chair

I would like to highlight two pieces of work arising from the above committees that may be of interest to you.

1. For more years than I care to remember NALC has been lobbying the government to enable local towns and parishes to be able to pay bills and accounts through BACS and not by cheques. The new payments system, I am pleased to report, has finally been agreed.

- I must personally thank Peter Lacey the Somerset County NALC Secretary and Financial Advisor to NALC and the government, for all his hard work on achieving BACS. Sadly Peter passed away suddenly in 2013 and did not live to see the new bill become law.
- 2. Those present at last year's annual Parish Assembly will recall that I spoke about the Council Tax Base reforms introduced by the Coalition Government at the end of November 2012. I reported that out of over 250 billing authorities given money from central government to pass down to their local town and parish councils, only 5 had failed to do so, Swindon Borough Council being one of them. The 5 have now become 4 and still include Swindon. This resulted in a loss to Stratton of £88,500. NALC has been pressing The Rt. Hon Eric Pickles, Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government, to intervene on these Councils' behalf.

I met Brandon Lewis MP, Parliamentary Under Secretary of State, with the NALC Chair in early December 2012 to put the case for the 14 town and parish councils in Swindon. He has promised to look into our case.

A message to Swindon Borough Council and all ward councillors, please pass down the money that was intended for town and parish councils, and stop saying, "We do not have to and why should we".

During 2013 I attended 23 meetings of NALC on behalf of the parish.

I have been invited, along with Cllr Patricia Roberts, to attend a Royal Garden Party at Buckingham Palace in May on behalf of NALC.

Parish News

The Peace Memorial

Although the memorial was commissioned to mark the centenary of the start of the First World War, its form and design have been inspired by the locality and the theme of reflection which was chosen by local schoolchildren.

The memorial has deliberately taken an unconventional form, to be a positive enhancement to the locality and to be a part of everyday life rather than a monument that is only acknowledged once a year. It comprises three elements: the new zig-zag path crossing the site which symbolizes chaos and the blood shed in conflict; a grail sculpture which provides a focus for reflection and contemplation; and a brick sculpture symbolizing St Margaret and the dragon protecting the grail and incorporating a seat for people to sit and reflect.

The grail forms the heart of the memorial with a world map and words of dedication and honours and acknowledges those affected by all conflicts throughout the world and throughout time.

The monument was designed by Tony Currivan, an architect working with Swindon Borough Council. The brick sculpture was designed in collaboration with and made by local artist Jane Rickards. Jane has been involved in a number of public space sculptures including the memorials at Alexandra Palace and Temple Quay in Bristol.

A Memorial Dedication Service will take place on Sunday 3 August at 3pm. The Royal British Legion will lead a parade from Grange Leisure to the site. All residents are warmly welcome to attend.

Parish Precept

Stratton St Margaret Parish Council is pleased to announce that the Precept for 2014/15 will be staying the same as last year.

The council continues to look at ways of reducing costs without affecting services and even though we have completed a major refurbishment of Grange Leisure Centre and added an All Weather Grass pitch we have managed this at no additional cost to the local taxpayer.

We will also be taking over the management of 12 areas from Swindon Borough Council to help them meet their budget constraints and it will give us the opportunity to improve local open spaces.


Help to shape the future of our Parish

Around the Parish...

Have You Been To Stratton Wood Recently?



Have you been to Stratton Wood recently? Over the past 12 months lots has happened here, with new paths, new waymarking, seasonal ponds and artwork all being added to this woodland. On a sunny summer's day, head over to enjoy a site which is great to explore with friends, family or if you want to have a quiet tranquil stroll.

The recent sunny weather has brought out a lot of wildflowers such as yellow rattle, oxeye daisy and meadow cranesbill. These flowers can be found throughout the site, but for a truly spectacular display, head for the two wildflower meadows at the northern end of the site.

Over the winter and into spring 2014, volunteers from the local community and Swindon's Volunteer Rangers have been undertaking hedge-laying along Kingsdown Lane. This is a traditional way to manage hedges to obtain a thick, livestock-proof hedge. It has made a huge difference, making the entrance much more open and welcoming and it also results in a hedge which is great for nesting birds.

We have had 18 volunteers attend in total in 2014, giving over 100 hours of their time, which is a fantastic effort and greatly appreciated. Hedge-laying can only be carried out when birds are not nesting – so the aim is to continue in the autumn/ winter of 2014.

We also are fortunate to have a couple of volunteers undertaking weekly butterfly transects - and there can be a lot to see, especially on a sunny day, such as peacock, orange tip, common and small blue as well as small tortoiseshell butterflies. Last year an astonishing 1,905 individual butterflies were recorded by our volunteers!

Three routes are now marked out with coloured way marking posts – two go around Stratton Wood and if you are feeling more adventurous one links to Stanton Park so you get to explore 2 lovely woods in one go. The Woodland Trust is about to install some information boards which will map out the routes and also give a little more information about the site.

Woodland Trust will be attending the Stratton Parish Council Festival on Saturday 19th July so please do come along and say hello. We will be making clay tree faces or leaf crowns for you and we look forward to hearing about your stories of Stratton Wood and we can give you more information about our favourite wood in Swindon (well we are a bit biased)!



Over the coming autumn/winter, SSE need to install a new electricity cable through the site which means the car park is likely to be closed at some point during this period. We regret that this will cause some disruption to visitors to Stratton Wood.

We are working closely with SSE to finalise the work schedule and will keep people informed through onsite posters and through the Parish Council newsletters and website.



The recent Ofsted inspection of Colebrook Infant Academy judged the school to be "good", which delighted staff, parents and children, given that the criteria for inspection has been tightened considerably.

Grange Leisure A New Beginning



The Grange Leisure refurbishment is now virtually complete and is definitely open for business.

The centre, built in the 1970's, had become tired and a lot of money was needed to catch up on outstanding maintenance to bring it up-to-date for the community and make it something to be proud of.

The first move was to relocate the Gym; the rebuilt squash courts give a new 40 station fitness suite over two floors with changing area. Frank Bruno visited the Gym and said it was of a high standard.

The All Weather Grass Pitch (AGP), which is to Football Association and Rugby Football Association standard can be used as a 9-a-side or two 7-a-side pitches. It was fitting that the first users were Stratton Junior FC.

In the main hall the new sprung floor is ideal for the CEROC dancing classes which are held every Tuesday. The hall and changing room roofs were replaced at the same time.

We also took the opportunity to redecorate and gave the Grange Bar its own access, and installed an outside canopy area and ramp to the bar.

A great success is the newly styled reception area which includes a café; this has been a huge hit providing a relaxing atmosphere. The café serves Lavazza coffee and a selection of snacks and treats. Cooked meals can be eaten here if you do not wish to go into the bar.

The last part of the rebuild was to relocate the Parish Office from Meadowcroft, reducing costs and enabling a greater integration of staff. A patio area has been added for summer café use, and a community library has been installed and the Parish Council is currently investigating the possibility of installing solar panels to reduce energy costs.

New Air Ambulance For Wiltshire

Wiltshire Air Ambulance Charitable Trust (WAACT) signed a 10-year contract in Swindon with Heli Charter Ltd for a new helicopter, which will come into service at the end of the year, when the lease on the current 12 year old aircraft expires.

The Wiltshire helicopter will be the first Bell 429 to operate as an air ambulance in the UK. It has a top speed of 150 knots and a range of 400 miles making rapid response to any incident within the county achievable within minutes.



Starting in the late autumn of 2014, the contract with Heli Charter covers the provision, maintenance and flying of the Wiltshire Air Ambulance for up to 19 hours a day, every day of the year. It also includes a replacement helicopter to be provided after 5 years. Paramedics and other medical support will continue to be provided by South West Ambulance Service NHS Trust (SWAST), with whom the Charity enjoys a close, efficient and effective working relationship.
