Nythe to leave Stratton St Margaret Parish in 2015

In two consultations carried out in 2012 and 2013, Stratton St Margaret Parish Council asked Nythe residents if they would like to stay in Stratton St Margaret and retain the existing parish boundaries.

Despite the majority of residents stating that they wanted to stay in Stratton St Margaret, the Parish Council is disappointed to confirm that Swindon Borough Council has decided to create a new Nythe Parish from 7 May 2015.

This will bring an end to an association between Nythe and Stratton that has been in existence since the Nythe estate was built on land that has always been a part of Stratton St Margaret Parish back to Saxon times. This association has benefitted residents from both areas from a pro-active Parish Council that has provided a range of services for the residents that were not provided by either the former Highworth Rural District Council or Thamesdown/Swindon Borough Council.

These services included cemeteries and burial grounds, street lighting, recreation grounds and dog bins to name just a few. The new Nythe Parish Council will now provide their own equivalent services as well as taking on the Melford Walk play area which Stratton St Margaret Parish Council.

The Parish Council would like to reassure our residents of Stratton St Margaret that it will continue to provide these services and that there will be no compromise to our high standards. Parishioners will still have the opportunity and priority should they wish to make use of our excellently maintained cemeteries and allotment site.

Stratton St Margaret Parish Council would like to wish the new Nythe Parish Council well for the future and hopes that it will be able to maintain the high standards that Stratton St Margaret Parish Council has been renowned for ever since it was first formed in the 1890s.




Neighbourhood Plan Update

Working Party


At a recent Working Party meeting, councillors, and volunteers were able to constructively discuss the initial survey findings and focus on their areas of interest.

Grange Leisure serves up School Dinners for Grange Federation

The new catering team

The recent Children and Families Act (2014) places a legal duty on primary schools to offer free meals to all pupils in reception, year 1 and year 2 from September 2014. For the Grange Federation this new duty increased the estimated meal provision as 250 meals per day above the 50 at the infant school and 50 at the juniors already receiving hot lunches.

Grange Federation was unable to meet the deadline for the refurbishment of their kitchen, and approached Stratton St Margaret Parish Councils' catering department to see if they could help for this academic year. Without the help of the Council, the school would not have been able to provide hot school meals.

The Council was due to refurbish their kitchen due to health and safety requirements, and through a tendering process, the Council commissioned Space Catering who completed the project against a very tight timescale.



Head Teacher at Grange Federation said "As a school, we have been overwhelmed by the support of the catering manager in particular, but the way in which the whole Leisure Centre have embraced the idea. It has certainly made the community feel closer as we are able to be supported, and hopefully support one another." "I have been very impressed by the service. The meal provision has run perfectly. In my view the team have far and away performed better than I could imagine."

Catering Manager, Richard White said, *"We've certainly* relished the challenge of producing over 250 hot meals a day. With the newly refurbished kitchen and an expanded catering team, including a new Chef and Kitchen Assistant, we've really embraced raising the profile of the Leisure Centre by offering this service for Grange Federation".

Apply for an allotment plot

Allotments provide valuable green space around the Parish and the surrounding areas. Stratton St Margaret Parish Council operates two sites in the Parish and has access to plots in Gorse Hill and South Marston.

There is currently a waiting list and the length of time people wait depends on how specific they have been about where they want the plot. To overcome the long waiting time, we're splitting larger vacant plots into a number of smaller plots and being more proactive about dealing with non-cultivation by plot-holders.

It was with great pride that Stratton St Margaret Parish Council was able to provide the people of Stratton with their own formal memorial in August this year. Although a Peace Memorial was chosen rather than a War Memorial, it is still fitting because it was dedicated on the anniversary of the start of the first of the two World Wars.

The memorial site and sculpture have been designed as a place for reflection for residents to take a moment to reflect on the past and to look to the future. The sculpture was built by local artist Jane Rickards with help from a Swindon Borough architect. Together they used elements of various designs which came from a competition which the Parish Council ran with Ruskin Junior School and Kingsdown School. The winning design entitled 'Place to Reflect' was the inspiration for the design of the memorial.

A £20,000 donation from Barrett Homes and fundraising events, such as the Choral Concert featuring the Military Wives held last year at Grange Leisure, have all helped to pay towards the cost of the new memorial.

Parish Council **Elections 2015**

Are you passionate about the area you live in?

Do you want improved local services?

There are over 9,000 parish, town, community and neighbourhood councils (local councils) representing around 16 million people across England and they form the most local level of government.

In May 2015 there will be local Parish Council Elections and 23 Parish Councillors will be required to serve Stratton St Margaret Parish Council.

The Council is non political, it elects its own Chairman each year and Committees to help with its decision making. It is recognised that there are some sectors of society who are under-represented on local authorities – such as those under 45, women and people from Black and Minority Ethnic (BME) backgrounds.

Stratton St Margaret Parish Council is a very large Parish Council, bigger than many Town Councils. It has a population of approx. 22,000, and employs 75 full and part time staff. Its income and expenditure exceeds £1 million. It is a burial authority, and provides facilities for its community such as allotments, play areas, Leisure Centre and Community halls.

Councillors may receive a small remuneration which is agreed by the Council every year to assist with expenses and will undertake necessary training in order to undertake their role effectively.

To become a Councillor you must meet the following criteria:

- Be a British citizen, or a citizen of the Commonwealth, or the European Union, and
- Be 18 years of age or older

You cannot stand for election if you:

- Are the subject of a bankruptcy restriction order or interim order
- Have within five years before the day of the election, been convicted in the United Kingdom of any offence and have had a prison sentence (whether suspended or not) for a period of over three months without the option of a fine
- Work for the Council for which you want to become a Councillor
